COVID Safety Practices

We are encouraging those who are considered to be at high risk for serious illness from COVID-19 to not volunteer at this time. Please reference CDC Recommendations. However, we do not have an age restriction for volunteers. We respect and honor our volunteers' personal choice and welcome all who feel safe volunteering at this time as long as they are able to follow our safety practices.

Your Part



Bring your own face covering or mask.
Your mask cannot have an external vent.

Wear closed-toed shoes.

Arrive 5 minutes before your scheduled shift. Use your mobile device to sign in for your shift (alternative sign-in options available if needed).



Wash your hands immediately upon entering the building. Sanitize hands regularly while on-site.

Wear gloves while working on projects (to be provided by MANNA).

Do your best to maintain a social distance of 6 feet whenever possible.

MANNA's Part



At MANNA, we:

Diligently **clean and sanitize** the Volunteer Center prior to and after every volunteer shift.

Have reduced the max number of volunteers on each shift, and increased our space for volunteer projects.

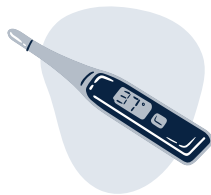
Require everyone entering the building to wear a facemask while on premises.

Check temperatures of everyone entering the building.

Provide latex-free gloves for volunteers to wear while working on projects.
